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Executive Summary

Nepal has a history on blood donation movement which started from 2002 B. S. by donating blood by legend of voluntary society Late Dayabir Singh Kansakar. Creating the underpinning in blood movement with the mount of first blood bank (Laxmi Blood Bank) before 1966 was initiated in the premises of Bir Hospital with least infrastructure & later in 1966 BTS was developed. NRCS being a sole authorize to organize comprehensive blood collection, storage and supply related services in Nepal mandating from 1992 April 6 by the then His Majesty Government (HMG) of Nepal gave the pavement for blood collection & related management. As there is no substitution of blood and there is no any other artificial replacement can be formed so blood donation is importantly and meaning fully in need. Since the first donation with the rise of time in 1981 it was banned on paid donation. Realizing the fact in need of blood donation and service for humankind in 1989 Nepal Blood Donors Club was established later in 1992 it became Blood Donors Association Nepal (BLODAN) playing the vital role on blood (Non Remunerated Voluntary Blood Donation - NRVBD) movements with federating the non remunerated blood donors, donor's organization, clubs and association. Effort and scaling up the non remunerated voluntary blood donation movement is major aim of BLODAN. Being responsible key stake holder in blood movement BLODAN had realized role & action plan meaning fully to manage the blood related service including non remunerated voluntary blood donation as main measure. Meaning full action & role of stakeholders are the major pavement to eliminate the blood movement related problem and issues. Thus, first national blood conference was the main sharing platform bringing all stakeholders and sharing the ideas, gap, issues, future way, coordinative point & clear role. As part of celebrating World Blood Donors Day 2013, BLODAN conducted week long program including oratory & art competition, rally, rewarding donors & organization. Press conference was organized to inform media & stakeholders about the First National Blood Conference prior to event. As BLODAN always conducted & conducting activities entirely voluntarily since from its establishment with this BLODAN took significant step & conducted First National Blood Conference with collective voluntary effort of individual & organization. Whole expense & collection are transparently included in this report with every detail which shows the evident of stab financially also.

Creating the history in blood movement BLODAN organized **First National Blood Conference**. Aiming **“Towards 100% Non Remunerated Voluntary Blood Donation”** entitling the slogan for conference was conducted with the huge participation of blood volunteers, medical personnel, health workers, blood activist from national & international level, doctors, nurses & related stake holders of blood movement. Key speakers from international & national level shared their valuable ideas & experiences. With formal inauguration by Hon. Rt. Vice President of Nepal, opening session was concluded with the good wishes speech. In total 17 presentations was shared dispersing in 3 plenary sessions in two days conference held on June 13 & 14, 2013. Total 9 international & 10 national speaker shared their presentation in plenary. Each plenary summed up with interaction and squat conclusion by accosting the participant's quires. Role & action plan

of key stake holders was discussed identified & wrote up through 5 group work in plenary followed by the presentation in mass, giving the future way & recommendation for all involving key stake holders. Conclusion of group work came up with the declaration of first national blood conference & preamble of declaration (*Annex 1*) was formally denoted in closing session followed by approval on working out in detail with the gist of group work & presenting it in report form for government of Nepal & stakeholders, hence First National Blood Conference – 2013 was declared.

On hand document is whole outcome of first national blood conference and we hope the action & role identified meaning fully will as well as must act as much as meaning fully to eliminated blood related issues and problem hence providing safety blood with accessibility to needy everywhere throughout the nation and reaching **“Towards 100% Non Remunerated Voluntary Blood Donation”**.

PART – 1

1.1 Introduction of Blood Donors Association Nepal (BLODAN)

Science has made many things possible never dreamed of by past generations. Development in medical science has led to successful treatment of disease, such as cancer and incredible surgery like kidney transplant. However, science is unable to create blood artificially. When a person meets with an accident or is suffering from a blood related disease s/he urgently needs safe blood transfusion the unavailability of which results in death. Such deaths are easily avoidable with access to safe blood. People of all ages in the world need safe blood to survive. The need of blood is universal but sadly access to blood is not. BLODAN is working hard to ensure availability of safe blood for everyone in all regions of the country.

BLODAN, as organization of non remunerated volunteers, exists to assist Nepal Red Cross Society Central Blood Transfusion Service (NRCS CBTS) in its goal to meet the demand for safe blood transfusion without replacement.

When BLODAN was established in 1990, there were many professional donors who were paid to donate blood. It was found that many of these donors were consuming alcohol and drugs and were ready to give bloods even before three months of the previous donation because they needed money. So there was no guarantee that patients were getting safe blood. BLODAN made a great effort to overcome this problem by refusing such unsafe blood donors. Nowadays blood supplied by Blood Transfusion Centre (Blood Bank) is collected entirely from non remunerated voluntary blood donors.

1.2 Objectives

BLODAN is working to meet the following four main objectives:

1. To make safe blood easily available to all those who need it in the country, with the blood being collected from non-remunerated voluntary blood donors.
2. To co-ordinate and facilitate the relationship between voluntary blood donors and blood donor organizations with NRCS, Blood Transfusion Service promoting Blood Donation Program in Nepal.
3. To recruit new donors for the future through motivational programs in schools, colleges, youth groups and others fields.
4. To create public awareness and make information freely accessible on voluntary blood donation and need of safe blood.

1.3 Achievement

Since from the establishment with the aim of advocating the blood movements BLODAN is dedicated with volunteer team work & continuing its activities. To meet the objectives BLODAN is conducting a variety of programs also to meet the increasing demand for blood. The major programs run by the association are to help donor education, motivation, interaction and recognition of donor. These programs are organized entirely through voluntary contribution. School education program, orientation for blood donors, regular donation camps, recognition of donor's organization/donor, interaction, celebrities involvement as a blood ambassador for nationwide campaign, World Blood Donors Day (WBDD) celebration & publication are major activities of BLODAN. BLODAN is also trying to use latest information technology facilities such as the Internet and Short Message System (SMS) to meet the supply as per demand for blood. Above all in this long run of blood movement till now BLODAN has following achievements:

- ◆ Continuous chain effort for raising awareness with the participation of youth & stakeholders creating the concernedness covering different age group.
- ◆ Enhanced member donors' organization & inspire donors for promoting non remunerated voluntary blood donation.
- ◆ Established the trend/culture of recognition to organization & individual donor nationwide.
- ◆ Formed as a pillar to support & implement National Blood Program. Addressing the issues of blood movement in policy level for serious attention towards action plan as a national concern.

PART – 2

2.1 First National Blood Conference

With the effort of raising the blood donation movement effectively BLODAN has always realized about the best measure that can be apply in the context of Nepal. BLODAN hand for achieving towards 100% non remunerated voluntary blood donation is always carried out by the team believing in the strength of team work and idea sharing. Ample of activities had been done in blood movements but still the concernedness for managing the blood & overcoming the issues with sustainable solution is a lacking aspects as shown by till to date. Demands are high comparing to managing the blood supply. Bloods are collected if any one donates & no one is forced for that. Donors care and retention is the one of the major aspects in implementing level & ownership of blood program as a national concerned by government in policy level.

Continuing the effort of blood movements towards 100% non remunerated voluntary blood donation first national blood conference was idea generated to inflame the blood movements as national issue hence National Blood Conference was the requirement for the nation to whispering and addressing properly about the strength, weakness and opportunities on national blood drive. The main objective of the conference is to create an environment to achieve 100% non remunerated voluntary blood donation. As being the pillar in key stakeholder BLODAN had realized and working hard for achieving 100% non remunerated voluntary blood donation. As of the time and situation interaction, campaign, rally etc are cyclic program of BLODAN.

It has been observed that the main causes of blood shortage in the nation are lack of awareness, motivation and information about blood and blood donation despite of various activities of entire blood activities of concern stakeholders' i.e. Nepal Government, World Health Organization, Red Cross Society and Blood Donors Association Nepal. While conducting the monthly interaction program with pre-donation organizations, most of the participants have been drawing attention to the need to motivate the people through various awareness programs and greater interaction between blood donor organizations and concern stakeholders because most of the people are still beyond the proper information about blood donation. BLODAN should promote the CLUB 25 Programs among various colleges and higher secondary schools students because they could be future donors. BLODAN recognizes the problems of demand and supply of blood and rectified that all the programs should be continued as before and has to be launched other different awareness campaign by targeting youth however BLODAN unable to function as its proposed plan due to financial constraints. Regular funds to run the programs continuously are insufficient. BLODAN manage the funds for the program by program basis. As per World Health Organization (WHO) to collect safe blood there must be an increment in recruitment of voluntary non remunerated regular blood donors. Voluntary blood donation is cost effective and enhances healthcare by preventing infection. Nepal Government has made a National Blood Policy, National Blood program and guidelines. A five year National Strategic Plan (2009-2013) has also been made to enhance voluntary non remunerated blood donation however the strategies plan has not been implementing successfully.

National & international level sharing with in and out of the countries had been never happened in Nepal in regards of blood donation movements in mass level in which BLODAN realized the importance of sharing the ideas, review the existing exercise done by national level, sharing the ideas, identifying the role with action plan for future way for achieving towards 100% non remunerated voluntary blood donation along with the meaning full participation and action of key stake holders. Scaling up the effort for blood donation movements thus, First National Blood Conference happened & National Blood Conference is the requirement the nation to whispering and addressing properly about the strength, weakness and opportunities on national blood drive.

2.2 Objectives:

The main objective of the conference is to create an environment to achieve 100% non remunerated voluntary blood donation and others are as below:

- To share the ideas, experiences, best practices & modality of voluntary blood donation from national to international level
- To identify the role with action plan of key skate holders meaning fully raising the concerned of state
- To recommend the future way for blood movements, related services, accessibility & availability for safe blood

2.3 Participation:

Conference was immensely taken part by national & international blood activist from different state of India, Maldives & Nepal. Coverage of participation was from doctors, nurses, health workers, blood volunteers, medical personnel, civil society, media personnel, organization (national & international) & representation of volunteer blood donor organization from all over the country. 2.5 Committee & Sub Committee

2.6 Program Structure

Two round of plenary session was concluded in the first day and one round of plenary session in second day. Total 17 paper presentations were done in that four round plenary sessions in different scenario of blood movement from national, international delegates and authority. The role of chairperson in plenary session was to conclude the presentation given by presenter and create the atmosphere for the interactions. And group discussion was conducted after end of plenary session for identifying the role and action plan of key stakeholders. Closing session was conducted adding with prize distribution and recognition program on the occasion of world blood donor day 2013. After the end and 1st and 2nd plenary session in the first day of conference culture show was presented by different artist from local blood donation club and cultural groups.

Opening the space for sharing experiences & addressing the quires of participants, time for interaction was given as major space. Chairing by expertise in each plenary was the major part for summarizing the plenary with the reflection of key presenter. Also summarizations by chairperson are reflected in key findings leading to the assimilation in declaration of conference.

4.1 Plenary session & summary - presentation by key speakers

4.2 Plenary 1

4.2.1 “Scenario of Voluntary Blood Donation in India” presentation by Mr. Apurba Ghosh - General Secretary of Federation of Blood Donors Organization of India (FBDIO).

Mr. Apurba Ghosh briefly presented over all scenario of voluntary blood donation and following were the major pithy of his presentation in plenary.

In the mean of geographically, density of population and the diversity of the culture and religion there is very challenge to fulfill the requirement of safe blood. Blood & Blood Products requirement per year 12 million units as of WHO. Before 2000 in India there was no national vision for blood transfusion service, only paid & replacement donation was mostly available. In 1990 there was the historic time for India in blood program followed by the consecutive years of struggle reaching to head of the nation with National Blood Program in 1994. In 2002 National Blood Policy to ensure 100% voluntary blood donation & safe blood transfusion service was approved by government of India through parliament in 2002. Realizing the policy was not enough Action Plan developed in 2003 followed by the Operational Guideline in 2007 covering the wide area of voluntary blood donation & its detail significant aspects – voluntary blood donation & its objectives, policy, role, format etc. After the policy formation and conduction of voluntary blood donation program increased from 69% to 83.5% between 2009 and 2012 inwards blood collection. Formation of National Blood Transfusion & State Blood transfusion council, role & involvement of organization & motivators, commitment to achieve 100% VBD are the achievements in blood movements in India. Dialogue continued by government of India with workshop focused on effective strategies of VNRBD, communication, public relation, donor care, blood science, motivation, donor retention, educating donors & training to staff as well as volunteers. Despite of challenges crossing the hurdles India formulate the policy by taking the owner ship of program by government itself along with the involvement of stakeholders. Achieving towards 100% NVBD is journey but not a destination and effort will be going on with sharing ideas and hard work.

Key findings:

- ◆ As of highly dense population demand of blood & blood product is high in India
- ◆ 1990–1994 Historic period of blood movements in India forming NBP
- ◆ From policy to national blood program is not only sufficient but action plan & operational guideline covering the wide area of voluntary blood donation with its major aspect is most important.
- ◆ Donor care, capacitating human resources, donor retention & communication are the vital part to be full filled. Role of government is pivotal for taking ownership.
- ◆ Voluntary blood donation is important and its journey but not a destination.

4.2.2 “National Blood Program in Nepal” presentation by Dr. Mukunda Sharma - Co Chief Consultant Pathologist of National Public Health Laboratory (NPHL).

Dr. Mukunda Sharma briefly presented about the National Blood Program in Nepal & following were the major pithy of her presentation in plenary.

In 1991, NRCS was mandated for collection, storage & supply of blood to hospital. NPHL designated as a focal point of blood safety & supervising all issues of BTS. In 1993 National Blood Policy developed & updated in 2006 followed by the revision still ongoing. In 2008 National Guidelines on management of BTS formed. Supported for the establishments of new blood centers in other districts. These were the commitment & support done by the government. Under the ministry of health and population National Steering Committee then National Blood Policy, legislative & regulation is set in organogram. National Technical Advisory Committee/NPHL, NRCS then CBTS Management Committee followed by central, regional & districts BTS are set under the frame. NRCS is mainly responsible for the collection of blood & NPHL is focal body to govern blood program in Nepal. Guiding principles of Nepal Blood Transfusion Service Policy states voluntary non remunerated blood donation, nonprofit basis, no harm, accessibility, confirmation of quality, intervention by NMC registered medical for blood transfusion, observation of right & duties, liable for legal action in case of pressure donation, purchase/sale strictly prohibited by law, confidentiality of donors in any case & adequate health of service providers/donors are the major coverage. It also state that NSC shall develop appropriate systems & procedures for enforcement of provisions of National Blood Program. NSC holds the legal responsibilities of NBP (draft sent for cabinet approval) constituting with 13 members chaired by DG of DoHS with the representative of major stakeholders. With the representation from line agencies to stakeholders NSC denotes meaning to develop & issue to national standard & guidelines on blood transfusion service & plan for long terms measure for BTS followed by the regular discussion. National Guidelines in Management of BTS in Nepal developed in 2008 is on the process of revision. National Technical Advisory Committee (NTAC) is formed under the NSC as a sub committee comprising 11 members including from NPLHA, hospitals, BLODAN & Hematologist. Regular monitoring of BTS for quality assurance, recommendation for measures to improve standards & retain voluntary donors, preparing national guideline for clinical use of blood, incorporation and suggestion for suitable curriculum in formal & non formal training in transfusion medicine are working roles of NTAC. Till now BTS is provided through 77 Blood Center (BC's) in 54 districts & 21 districts lack BCs. Also blood component facility available in 10 centers covering 4 development regions. Government of Nepal holds the activities for policy & plan, NRCS CBTS for collection, storage & supply with processing, testing, management & distribution, BLODAN for motivation, awareness and donor recruitment, medical personnel for blood transfusion, WHO for technical & financial support. UNDP/DFID & International Red Cross for equipment support. These are under the activities of each stakeholder. In 2010, 5 years strategic plan was endorsed by government (MoHP) for strengthening BTS in Nepal with the aim of providing safe blood to meet the needs, establishing NBP with legislative framework & encourage the regular voluntary donors in all blood centers. Having the coverage from policy, plan & guideline for blood management still monitoring supervision is in need.

Key findings:

- ◆ Nepal is running with National Blood Policy developed in 1993 which was updated in 2006 & still revision is going on. Different committee had been formed for implementation & monitoring of blood management along with stake holders but still meaning full result is not gained in Nepal.
- ◆ Government of Nepal is accountable for plan & policy of blood program. NRCS CBTS for collection, storage, testing & supply. Out of 75 only 54 districts are benefitted with blood centers but still management is huge issue for scaling up.
- ◆ Policy also emphasized on voluntary non remunerated blood donation but still effort is not being adequate. Although having legal binding still practices are against in blood management.

4.2.3 “NRCS Blood Transfusion Service Present Scenario” presentation by Mr. Janardan Pokharel – Senior Administration Officer of NRCS Central Blood Transfusion Service (CBTS).

Mr. Janardan Pokharel briefly presented about the present scenario of NRCS CBTS and following were the major pithy of his presentation in plenary.

In 1966 BTS was established & NRCS is mandates for conducting blood programs in Nepal. Collection from voluntary non remunerated donors was started from 1982. Nationwide 86 blood center in 62 districts currently. Presenting the collection and supply status of Nepal recorded in CBTS in 2012 – 177195 units was collected and 249733 units were supplied nationwide. Annual blood collection in CBTS – 67507 units & supply 131585 units annually. Similarly rare RH negative group blood supply – 6364 units. Illustrating the picture of demand and supply gap has been seen in blood management. Nationwide male donors are 84.4% and female 15.1%. Lab testing, motivation, counseling, component production, storage, cross match supply are key activities of BTS. NCASC, NHSP, NPHL, WHO, IFRC, LRCS, Collaboration with medical colleges & hospitals, embassies, BRCS, BD organization are providing external support. Replacement donation is 6063 units in CBTS. Voluntary donation is still lacking behind and promotional activities are essential. National Blood Policy, guideline, youth circles successful & motivated, central BTS as a referral for BTS external support for quality development & prevalence of infection relatively low are playing as the strength. Although the challenges remains such as lack of defined annual financial support to CBTS, lack of manpower in medial & technical areas, inadequate infrastructures, no academics development in transfusion medicine, less number of blood collection in strategic location & shortage of blood on & off. Further plan is exploring the possibilities with different agencies for development, expanding the component facilities at district level, revision of strategic plan for BTS, establishing regular blood donation centers, approaching medical institution for academic degree 7 mobilizations of youth to manage sustainable blood supply.

Key findings:

- ◆ NRCS in 1996 collected 157 units of blood as CBTS established. 62 districts are benefited with blood centers. There is gap in demand and supply of blood. Rare (RH negative) group blood management is a challenge. Comparatively male donors are high than female.
- ◆ Blood collection & lab testing are some of the key activities of BTS. Although being gained huge support from donor to NRCS CBTS still problem on blood management is roaming. Lacking transfusion specialist or related study is main challenges along with infrastructure.
- ◆ Still NRCS CBTS plan for possibly future way for exploring probable area with different agencies & extending the facilities but meaning full participation as well as role key stakeholders remains to be answered in blood management issue.

4.3 Plenary 2

4.3.1 “Experience of BLODAN in Regional Chapter” sharing by Mr. Bimal Bahadur Shakya – Regional Vice President of BLODAN from rupandehi district chapter (Western Development Region).

Mr. Bimal Bahadur Shakya shared the experience of region & district, following were the major sharing in plenary

BLODAN in rupandehi district is conducting regular motivation program for voluntary blood donation. For fund raising each members of BLODAN separate Nrs.1/ per head each day for saving in fund. Playing vital role by being standby for blood donation & providing blood for needy. In Kapilvastu district blood service is lacking due to many reason in inner area. Still BLODAN is on going with its effort for blood movements in districts and involved as major stakeholders in district and region for advocating blood movement to provide blood. Still BLODAN from central level can activate the district chapter & held exposure visit outside the valley for sharing the ideas and knowing the status. Recognition and appreciation also need to be accelerated.

Key findings:

- ◆ Regular motivation for non remunerated voluntary blood donation is major activities carried out by BLODAN in region and district. Volunteer basis is challenges to manage. As comparing to kathmandu, region and districts have different scenario.
- ◆ BLODAN in region and district level is playing pivotal role for advocating blood movement being. BLODAN from central level can accelerate the motivation & holding the program in region and district level.

4.3.2 “Nepal Hemophilia Society” presentation by Mr. Bed Raj Dhungana – General Secretary of Nepal Hemophilia Society (NHS).

Mr. Bed Raj Dhunagana – General Secretary of National Hemophilia Society presented about the hemophilia society & its activities and following were the major pithy of his presentation.

In 1992, society was formed under the chairmanship of Dr. Ranjan Pd, Singh as social organization for providing treatment service to hemophilic person. In 1992 affiliated to World Federation Of Hemophilia Society & in 2006 with National Disabilities Federation. Expanding up to 6 districts branch had been formed. Formation of youth committee & mothers club for awareness & effectiveness targeting to People with Hemophilia (PWH). Hemophilia care center had been established in Bir Hospital (1998) & in Kathmandu Medical College (2005) currently in civil service hospital also. Factor, plasma & cryo had been providing from those center also service availability in any situation. Successful surgery had been done till now. Blood donation is one of the major activities of organization along with to provide service related to hemophilia. Till now information & awareness, interaction, camp, counseling, training, raising fund, creating the environment to present hemophilia by defining as disabilities & placing in its category – advocacy & lobbying are the activities done. Till now 438 are identified but it is estimated that 3000 are present comprising of different factors. Externally organizations are helping including BLODAN as NHS is implementing partner. Challenges remains for identifying hemophilic person & their treatments, concernedness of government, establishment of care center in hospital with access & availability of service.

Key findings:

- ◆ Hemophilia is also an emerging health issues need to be concerned & realizing this fact NHS was established in 1992 to provide service for PWH. Still service for PWH is not accessible at all in coverage. Estimation of PWH is 3,000 but 438 are only recorded showing the gap.
- ◆ Youth and mothers group are formed and implicated as tools for awareness. In capital hemophilia related treatment is available & expanding but still needs a lot effort and concern from different level to mitigate.
- ◆ NHS is advocating for hemophilia & related services. External agencies are supporting but required national concerned & sustainable program.
- ◆ Still to identify and provide treatment to PWH is challenge.

4.3.3 “Motivation & its Factors” presentation by Mr. Durga Padhi – President of TYAGA, India.

Mr. Durga Padhi briefly presented about motivation & its factors, following were the major pithy of his presentation and sharing.

Motivation comes from Latin language which means motive meaning move. It implies on sharing of emotion and influence. More desire more motivation as driving force. In blood donation movements motivation plays a very vital role. Voluntary blood donation is achievable through motivation. Motivational factors need to be found out by donor motivators. Care, support, counseling, awareness, events all relates to motivating but depends on how it is driven. Identifying the donors and motivating them with inform & responsible decision is crucial. Organizing first National Blood Conference its self is motivational factors as it influence other and drive for the concernedness. An event in odissa - India was inspiration as well as motivation BLODAN also was the part of motivation. Hence voluntary blood donation requires motivation for all especially for donors and it's a continuous chain process.

Key findings:

- ◆ Care, support, counseling, awareness relates to motivation depends on how it is and was motivated.
- ◆ Identification of donor and motivating them with inform and force free influence with care is crucial as well as acting factors for blood donation movements. For more motivation more sharing is in need.

4.3.4 “Role of IEC & IT in Blood Donation” presentation by Er. Deva Priya Dhar – Executive Member of Federation of Indian Blood Donors Organization (FIBDO) & vice President of Let Us Care for You (LUCY) India.

Er. Deva Priya Dhar presented briefly on role of IEC & IT in blood donation and following were the major pithy of his presentation.

An effective IEC material is major tools for creating effects but depends upon on how we use them for our cause accordingly to reach the people through different means. Using social network is massively prevails worldwide can be used as tools. India posses high number in south Asia. Users are high in social networking area but main thing is to use it in for our cause for blood movements. Writing on friend’s wall, twitting & emails are few examples. Creating virtual group sites for blood donation creating the platform to discuss & interact. Also alumni, music & other groups’ formation can accelerate the blood donation movements, Creating more forum and space in Google search and online promoting. Using the occasion as a medium of sharing message of blood donation like any events happening around the community to world. Video, presentation, audio, news, article can be upload and published on line for blood movements. Online involvement for blood donation can be in great use for bringing people in one forum and create space to advocate dialogue & strengthen the sustainable chain for voluntary blood donation around the world. People can use less time for this cause and optimum result can be achieved. These tools can be replicate in various ways but avoiding replication in same place. Providing the forum and space in every web based technology with free access can be major role player for motivation and involvement.

Key findings:

- ◆ Information Education Communication (IEC) & Information Technology (IT) are effective tools that can be used for in blood donation.
- ◆ Globally using social network, web page etc is very famous and useable and can be used for creating concernedness, dialogue, discussion, interaction, awareness, information sharing, updating the events etc regarding blood donation
- ◆ Free service will provide more involvement in blood donation movement through IEC & IT can be effective among young people.

4.3.5 “Campaign Strategies Donor Care & Retention” presentation by Mr. Biswaroop Biswas – Secretary of LUCY & FIBDO India.

Mr. Biswaroop Biswas presented briefly about donor care and retention strategies. Following were the major findings of his presentation.

Education, Motivation, Donation & Retention are four pillars of Voluntary Blood Donation (VBD). Sources of VBD are students’ union, local clubs, religious, organization, government office, NGOs, political organization, women organization & related other forum. Average (30-120 donors) and mega camps (-1000 above) are two types of VBD camp. Seminar, workshop, street campaigns, casual chats, sit in draw, street drama, especial vehicle to attract, magic show, sticker campaign, rally, school education, IEC materials distribution, pledge program, screening IEC, cultural event, recognition/appreciation, birthday & festival camp, camps at significant places, special people blood donation, exhibition are example done by LUCY. Role of motivators and camp organizer is important. In every events of blood donation management has to be done accordingly. Settings like reception for donors, accompanying by friendly behaviors, pre & post advice, bed side volunteer, punctuality of work in camp avoiding unnecessary circumstances, donors screening by doctors & technicians, availability of healthy and hygienic refreshments. Similarly environment of camp has to be properly set avoiding the crowd & privacy of donor screening, decorating camp with IEC materials. Behavior is most important in camp so cheerfully volunteer need to be present. Complaints needs to be handled properly and donors must be appreciated. Follow up care for donors as much as possible. Similarly, donors care is essential part. Proper donor screening is required covering proper weight measurement & hemoglobin level must. Screening can be done openly or closed. Trained technicians also required to avoid complications such as nerve damage or infection. Role is of all to provide full donor care.

Key findings:

- ◆ Education, motivation, donation & retention are four pillars of VBD. Different organization, forum, clubs including political party offices, campus, club, religious organization, NGOs & other related forum can be the sources of VBD.
- ◆ Seminar, street drama, vehicle show, magic show, school education program, rally, screening of IEC, are major strategic intervening point for VBD
- ◆ Donors care & follow up after donation is crucial part. Donors must be care properly from entry to exit level. Pre and post donation advice is must.
- ◆ Donors screening by concerned technical personnel & hygienic refreshment had to be managed in donation camps. Trained technicians for donation camps are vital for avoiding the unavoidable circumstances.

4.3.6 “Stem Cell Registry – Need of Hour” presentation by Mr. Kallol Ghoshal – Asst Secretary of LUCY & Member of FIBDO India.

Mr. Kallol Ghoshal – Asst Secretary of LUCY presented on stem cell registry and following were the major findings of his presentation.

It involves extracting bone marrow containing normal stem cells from a healthy donor. If bone marrow is destroyed then stem cell transplant becomes necessary. It can be done through different types like autologous hematopoietic stem cell transplant, allogeneic & HLA typing. From bone marrow (usually from the hip bone) & from peripheral blood i.e the blood stream in the body, stem cells are collected. Again where can we find the donor but we have from our locality & can be identified thus motivation and awareness for blood donation is most and stem cell registry is the need of an hour. Stem cell registry is not widely accepted in India. Samples collected from volunteers then typed, factors are listed on the registry, and registry is integrated with global registries & will be called if it matches. Myths are roaming like its painful, receiving from family member etc. So it needs to be done in timely and required awareness and action.

Key findings:

- ◆ Stem cell involves extracting bone marrow containing stem cells from a healthy donor. If bone marrow is destroyed then stem cell transplant becomes necessary. It can be done through different types like autologous hematopoietic stem cell transplant & HLA typing (takes long time).
- ◆ For stem cell donor we need to identify and if known can be in contacted and follow up but without pressure. Till now there is no cell registry in India.
- ◆ Myths are roaming around like painful, bone marrow is taken from the spine etc but it doesn't make any value in reality. So need of an hour is to scale up the awareness and information so that no one would leave the world.

4.3.7 “Maldivian Blood Donors (MBD)” Presentation by Mr. Ibrahim & Mr. Ismal representative from Maldivian Blood Donors, Maldives.

Mr. Ibrahim and Mr. Ismal presented briefly about MBD & its activities. Following were the major pithy of their presentation.

MBD was formed in 2006. In 2009 registered as nongovernmental organization. MBD has 3000 registered donors across the country & 9000 member in groups. It conducts social media network like face book for opening the space for blood donation movements, events & function for raising the blood movements, campaigns for blood donation in different places for achieving the voluntary blood donation.

Key findings:

- ◆ MBD forming in 2006 as an Non Governmental Organization (NGO) has 3,000 registered donors 9,000 members in group throughout the country. IT based tools in online are in use for blood donation campaign and awareness yielding effective impact in community of Maldives.

4.3.8 “A Novel Organization of West Bengal & its Blood Donors Motivation Strategies in West Bengal” presentation by member representatives Mr. Amlan Kr. Acharay & Mr. Gautam Guha, West Bengal India.

Mr. Amlam Acharya and Mr. Gautam Guha briefly presented about novel organization of West Bengal and blood donors motivation strategies in west Bengal. Following are the major pithy of their presentation

Modern medical science is very much dependent on blood transfusion like major surgical operations; major accidents resulting in profuse blood loss, women in child birth and new born babies, cancer patients, severe burn victims etc all require blood transfusion. Without human blood donor there can be no blood transfusion but over the globe blood donors belongs to minor community because nobody is born as a blood donor & myth about blood donation. Motivation is in need and trained human resources & motivators are required as of time. In 1979 when annual blood collection was 2493, in West Bengal 89 voluntary blood donors formed hundred percent voluntary organizations to motivate, recruit and retain voluntary blood donors. It's all entirely volunteer work. First task was training up to large number of donor motivators throughout the state via structured training program of different modules ranging from day's workshop to full length diploma courses. Significant days like national, international, local festival marked for blood donation. Education, Motivation, Donation in Camp, Recognition of Donors were the four techniques used. Education focusing blood donation awareness, motivation focused on IEC materials & joining club, recognition of donors & appreciation. Renowned leaders of group in society were used as approach for blood donation; long term method is structured in school education program. West Bengal now collects annually 0.6 million units of blood from the voluntary blood donors & 99% collection is from outdoor camps. 47% donors are from 18-24 age groups. Through subscription, donation, sponsorship, grant, trust, govt, universities, corporate sector financial support has been uplifted.

Key findings:

- ◆ Blood transfusion is inevitable & there is no substitution of blood, human blood is in need. Without human donor no one can gets blood or no blood transfusion can take place.
- ◆ Motivation and trained human resources are in need factors for blood.
- ◆ Training for capacity development for donor motivation in structured form can yield trained human resources for blood movement.
- ◆ Education, motivation & IEC material distribution are the four techniques that can help to achieve VBD. Also marking significant days for blood donation will create habitual trend for blood donation.

4.4 Plenary 3

4.4.1 “Clinical Practice Guide on Blood Transfusion” presentation by Dr. Bishesh Poudyal – Chief of Hematology Department & Bone Marrow Transplant, Nobel Hospital, Kathmandu Nepal

Dr. Bishesh briefly presented on clinical practice guide on blood transfusion. Following were the major findings of his presentation.

Issues had been in blood transfusion as major concerned. Donation means can or can't donate. Healthy aged 18-60 yrs with normal blood pressure can donate but if anyone has complication related to heart, high blood pressures, on course of strict medication, major surgery, unexplained illness, hepatitis B or C can't donate. Then also after some time with the advice from doctors they can donate depending upon the condition of health being. Usually traditional medication need to wait 3 days, antibiotics 1 week & anti malaria 4 weeks. Tattoo ear piercing or acupuncture requires a deferment period of 12 months. Generally autologous and allogenic are two types of blood donation. Screening from pre and post needs to be requiring in blood donation. Determining the compatibility cross match is needed only for whole blood, granulocyte and packed cell. Blood in emergency situation – O groups called as universal donor. For transfusion need to decide what is to be transfused avoiding the search for whole blood and many thinks whole blood contains everything. Still evidence base in not sufficient to support routine administration of fresher blood to critically ill patients. Indications for packed RBC are such as transfusing when symptomatic & whole blood should be avoided if target is to only increase hemoglobin. 1 unit increase 1g of hemoglobin. Frozen RBC – storing in 65 degree centigrade & used to store rare blood groups. Aphaeresis platelets are obtained using automated instruments. Due to latest technologies we can directly go for what we want to have. Instrument is in Nobel Hospital but it also needed to be in blood banks. Most of the doctors are also unaware of blood banks. Every medical students needs to have the class covering contents of blood banks and BLODAN can take the initiation for that. Academic institution need to produce transfusion medicine health worker by establishing in academic line. In text books we don't find the clear information about blood transfusion so we have to be serious on that as doctors are emerging day by day. Guidelines need to indicate clearly about blood transfusion & its implementation. BLODAN can play and also playing vital role for taking the initiation along with other stakeholders.

Key findings:

- ◆ Donor screening should be make main issue in Blood transfusion like donor healthy lifestyle, behavior, etc. To fulfill this issue pre and post donation counseling practice has to be implicated.
- ◆ Autologous and allogenic are two types of blood donation. However only allogenic blood donation is in the practice in the country. Autologous blood donation issue can also make the subject of discussion for safe blood.
- ◆ Best requirement or requisition practice from doctor can also create comfortable to arrange blood to the patient so that all medical representative and concern has to update as far possible.
- ◆ Some latest international technologies are still beyond our access so that Government of Nepal & CBTS has to be introduced such technologies which can preserve blood more than year.

4.4.2 “Blood Transfusion Service: A Challenge” presentation by Dr. Ashok Joshi - Head of Department, Pathology, Bir Hospital.

Dr. Ashok Joshi concisely presented on blood transfusion service and challenge. Following were the major findings of his presentation.

In 2000 BS Dayabir Kansakar did first blood donation in Nepal. In 2023 BS, NRCS BTS first time initiated to conduct blood transfusion service in the country in the premise of Bir Hospital. It's a fact that every two second someone needs blood in world. There is no substitute of blood. Voluntary Blood Donation is one who gives blood or donates the blood in his/her own consent without expecting anything. New voluntary Blood Donation (VNBD) are first time donor, lapsed VNBD are the one who gave in past but can't give or fit in current criteria, regular VNBD is the one who donates at least 3 times and continue it. Replacement donor is one member of family or friend of patient who donates blood in replacement of blood needed for the particular without involvement of any monetary or any other benefits. Paid or professional are the one who exchange for payment. As of time in using the equipments to modern equipments is noted like replacing bottles with bags but need of human volunteers to donate blood has not changed. According to WHO normally 2% of population donate blood will lead no shortages. 0.66% current donors in our country. Blood collected through Voluntary Non Remunerated (VNR) is 70% & replacement 30%. 54 out of 193 countries have achieved 100% VBD where 68% are developed countries. Various reason appear for donating blood some them are reassurance of getting blood in need, service to the community & recognition/awards etc. Similarly illiteracy, fear complex, medical excuses are few examples for not donating blood. Causing weakness, disturbing the balance of body, weight gain, transmission of other genes are examples of myth related to blood donation. Blood is always needed for human being in many cases. 1 out of 10 hospitals needs a blood transfusion. Regular donation lowers the cholesterol, lipid levels, decreases incidence of heart attacks, strokes. In Nepal we don't have transfusion specialist causing the lack of manpower yielding to the problems in management of blood related issues. We have to make blood donation a habit, donate regularly, and motivate others for voluntary blood donation.

Key findings:

- ◆ Globally every 2 second is requirement of blood to someone. There is no any other substitution of blood. Voluntary Blood Donation is the vital part as root forming for blood transfusion. New, lapsed, & regular three types of volunteer blood donor.
- ◆ As of time globally many things are changed but one thing has not changed means need of human blood donors.
- ◆ Donating by 2% of population can yield the elimination of blood shortage in Nepal. Various reasons occur for donating blood but still myth is rooted due to false reason.
- ◆ Regular blood donation is good for health. Nepal lacks the blood transfusion specialist. Regular blood donation is in need and is the main source of solution for which every one of us has to make a habit of regular blood donation

4.4.3 Sharing by Dr. Ranjan Prasad Singh- Member of National Technical Advisory Committee (NTAC).

Dr. Ranjan Prasad Singh – shared about NTAC curtly & following were the major findings of his sharing.

In Nepal blood donation and related program had been going on. National Technical Advisory Committee was formed to monitor BTSCs for quality assurance, to prepare guidelines on the clinical use of blood & way to suggest for VBD. Still the efforts are going. BLODAN is leading for NRVBD movements with different program also being a key stakeholder. Government needs to take responsibilities seriously from the side of state for blood program in Nepal. Ownership of national blood program by government is still in need of much rising. BLODAN needs to play the vital role in adequate supply of blood. Jointly work can be done with mutual coordination among us so government must play a key role along with line stakeholders.

Key findings:

- ◆ National Technical Advisory Committee was formed to monitor BTSc for quality assurance. It's a fact that government had to take the ownership and play action oriented role in blood program of Nepal.
- ◆ Joint work in effective basis with mutual cooperation between stakeholders is in need to eliminate the problem of blood management in Nepal

4.4.4 “BLODAN & Vision” presentation by Mr. Mahendra Bilash Joshi Central President of Blood Donors Association Nepal.

Mr. Mahendra Bilash Joshi briefly presented about the vision of BLODAN with the role & action plan of key stake holders. Following were the major findings of his presentation.

BLODAN is umbrella organization of non remunerated voluntary blood donors', donor's organization and clubs. With 8 districts chapter it comprise with strong volunteer team worker. With aim of creating atmosphere to make available blood without replacement & advocating for the blood movements. Till to date it's a volunteer work in BLODAN. Affiliating with NSC, NTAC, IFBDO, SMN & HBMC BLODAN is continuing its effort by doing awareness, motivation, youth mobilization, e blood donation, Rh negative blood & fresh blood management, non holiday blood donation camps & WBDD celebration. Continuous chain effort for pledging the blood movements in Nepal & establishing BLODAN itself as a pillar to support and implement National Blood Program as key stake holders & addressing the issues of blood movements in policy level are the major achievements of BLODAN. Sustainable resources is main challenges although with the strength of continuous volunteer work, intense involvement in blood movements & result oriented vision BLODAN envision the future strategies for achieving towards 100% non remunerated voluntary blood donation with area & tools with the challenges & role of key stake holders to full fill in action on following area – (*Details in annex*)

1. Volunteer donors recruitment & retention
2. Donor care & free availability of safe blood to patients
3. Research & monitoring
4. Integration with multi sectors – education, media, commercial institution etc.
5. Competencies – Human Resource/Capacity development, fund mobilization, sustainability & continuation.

In order to achieve 100% NRVBD above areas are identified and envisioned by BLODAN & following are key stakeholders playing role as a whole:

1. Government (MoHP, DoHS.MoF, MoY) for taking ownership of national blood program & upgrading the policy as well as developing monitoring/supervision mechanism with sustainable resource providing.
2. NRCS – Technical support & capacitating for NRVBD & supporting regular activities of BLODAN
3. BLODAN – Mobilizing donor organization, regular donors care/support & sustainable motivational program
4. Funding agencies – Investing resources & integrating in relevant program in different sectors compulsorily

Key findings:

- ◆ In Nepal BLODAN has been continuing the chain effort for blood related program & founded the trend of recognition as motivation & advocating the blood movement. Still sustainable resources is challenging factors
- ◆ Volunteer donor recruitment/ retention, donor care, free availability of safe blood, research, monitoring, integration with multi sector & competencies along with institutional development can yield effective result for achieving 100% NRVB.
- ◆ Identifying role of involving key stakeholders with action plan & ownership of National Blood Program & should have to be taken by government as a major part followed by the regular implementation and monitoring with the involvement of stakeholders for sustainable solution of blood management in Nepal.

4.4.5 “Sharing of Friends of Rh Negative” presentation by Mr. Jeevan Basnet – President of Friends of Rh-ve Blood Group.

Mr. Jeevan Basnet briefly shared about RH negative group & its activities. Following were the major sharing.

In 1995 friends of Rh negative blood group was formed knowing by Rare Blood Group as common forum of negative blood groups/donors. As of available data recorded by this group only 50% of donors area available currently in negative blood donors. It's in need of demands and management is important. Especially this group contributes their effort to arrange negative blood management as well as spreading the message of requirement unification of negative blood group people through conducting interaction & meeting. Also formed committees & managed donors call service for negative blood providing to needy. Currently negative blood group demand level is high from hospital such case like heart surgery demand 12 pints. Motivational program for such donors is lacking. No fund support and its all volunteer work. Expanding awareness program, sustainable resources/management, motivational program, regular coordination and concernedness among stakeholders, capacity development program & special care support for regular donors are lesson learned.

Key findings:

- ◆ Few number of negative blood group is collected from blood donation camp so that stand by volunteer blood donor arranging is the alternative way to full fill the demand of negative blood group so managing negative blood group is still a major challenge. Although voluntarily Friends of Rh Negative Blood Group is managing from its best level lacks sustainable resources.
- ◆ Demand of negative blood is high day by day as hospital demands more units of negative blood. Motivational factors are lacking for donor care. Having 50% of donors for negative is its self a triggering situation & need to have serious concern.

4.4.6 “Sharing of Club 25 Nepal” presentation by Mr. Rajan Kandel – President of Club 25 Nepal.

Mr. Rajan Kandel briefly shared about Club 25 Nepal & its activities. Following were the major sharing.

Club 25 Nepal is youth concept of promoting voluntary blood donation. Launched from Zimbabwe in 1989. Youth pledged to donate 25 times (18-25) year’s age is main concept. Recruitment of young people as blood donors and promoting their healthy behaviors for healthy life style avoiding the risk of HIV & AIDS are aiming factors. Club 25 Nepal is global social club. In 2006 first interaction program done & second in 2007. Existing sister organization of BLODAN in Nepal. Camp, rally, awareness, trainings and workshop are major activities. Mostly young people are benefited with knowledge, skills for healthy life and developing future donors. As campuses are forum for Club 25 it creates space for promotion of blood donation. Individual & organization member ship are entry point.

Key findings:

- ◆ Youth full concept of promoting NRVBD by mobilizing & putting youth as a donor for tomorrow is effective. Creating responsible youth for tomorrow pledging to donate 25 times of age 18-25 yrs is globally practiced.
- ◆ Recruiting of young donor & promoting healthy behaviors among youth group is effective tools for VBD. Youth to youth approach is result oriented with their participation for regular VBD.
- ◆ Club 25 Nepal is appropriate platform for executing youth blood program in Nepal.

Part – 5

5.1 Group discussion on Role & Action Plan of Key Stakeholders

For the meaning full participation towards productive result conference was aimed to have the view for identifying the role/action plan of key stakeholders for future way recommendation by effective contribution & sharing.

5.2 Procedure and group work:

5.2.1 Procedure

As of the scheduled work, completing the plenary of second day group work was carried out. Five groups were formed. International participants were in one group and national participants were divided in four groups. With the aim of identifying the role and action plan of key stake holders to promote, implement, & sustainably managing the blood related issue from center to grass root level throughout the country was expected outcomes of group work.

Key stakeholders identified were as follow:

1. Government
2. Nepal Red Cross Society/Blood Transfusion Service
3. Funding Agencies
4. Blood Donors Association Nepal (BLODAN)

5.2.2 Group work:

Identified role & action plan of stake holders by group discussion in plenary working in 5 groups were prepared through discussion, written in chart paper followed by the presentation by each group leader explaining all points & comments for clarification & suggestion for additional remarks were given by other group. Participants were given flexible time for group work to put their voices.

Following were points the outcomes of group discussion explained in plenary:

Role and action plan of government:

- Ownership of National Blood Program & integration in all level for blood program
- Transparency in investment & expenses of budget for blood program
- Providing human resource & continuation of resources
- Free blood to all & budget allocation for motivation program for BLODAN
- BLODAN to be included meaning fully in every committee related to blood movements & let BLODAN to monitor blood related program.
- Restriction by law in sale and purchase of blood
- Local government should support blood program
- Integration of blood information in curriculum from secondary level
- Government should intervene the regular space of blood information in all types of media (visual, audio & print)
- Formation of National Blood Council for driving national blood program
- Regular monitoring, evaluation & supervision

Role and action plan of NRCS/BTS:

- Providing Technical/educational/professional support.
- Motivation & awareness program support
- Preparing human resources
- Accessibility of blood to all
- Managing blood supply
- Uniformity of blood transfusion service
- Form self-governing structure of CBTS & BTS
- Transparency of each and every activities related to blood
- Develop CBTS as research center

Role and action plan of funding agencies:

- Continuous support
- Sustainable plan for investing V.B.D programmes
- Joint Monitoring of program
- Support on the work basis
- Capacity development of stakeholders
- IEC materials promotion and fund support
- Work with stakeholders closely and compulsorily
- Exposure opportunity

Role and action plan of BLODAN:

- Regular mobilization of donors organization & donors
- Data management
- Continuity of national level program
- Motivational program
- Providing & playing functional role for government in blood movements
- BLODAN should take full ownership of motivation & awareness program
- BLODAN has to be in federation structure acquiring entire blood donors organization as well as individual to promote the activities for achieving NRV safe blood

5.3 Major Findings of group discussion on Role & Action Plan of Key Stakeholders

- ◆ Government as being main body need to take the full ownership of blood program & related management for implementation in sustainable & effective way along with the meaningful partaking of stakeholders with monitoring & supervision. Government must include BLODAN in every steps of blood related program.
- ◆ Nepal Red Cross Society as being in sole position of managing blood supply & storage need to focus on capacitating human resources in blood management issue, providing technical support & managing the blood supply with the accessibility of safety blood reaching to all along with motivation program.
- ◆ BLODAN as being a volunteer running association dedicated for blood movement need to play as one of the major key stakeholder role with involving in policy to implementation level. Mobilization of donor organization from every level & functional role playing for government to support blood program without avoiding efficient participation in government & stakeholder's body. Motivational & donor care program needs to be one of the major area of BLODAN to work & continue the national level program for blood movement.
- ◆ Funding agencies are of great resource & support hence continuous support by investing in sustainable plan for blood program. Providing the support on result oriented work basis eliminating the dependencies, capacitating the stakeholders by working closely. Creating the exposure for sharing & participation global forum for enhancing the idea & best practices.

Part – 6

6.1 Declaration of First National Blood Conference

Blood transfusion is indispensable & core component of health care. Timely availability of safe blood and blood products is essential. National role & capacity determines the management in over all outlooks of blood related program hence Blood Donors Association Nepal (BLODAN) organizing the conference & met in Kathmandu, Nepal from 13-14 June 2013 having common viewpoint for national requirement of blood program & achieving towards 100% non remunerated voluntary blood donation, measured the need as below:

Meaningful Role & Action Plan of Key Stakeholders

Hence hereby First National Blood Conference - 2013 declares that:

1. **Government of Nepal (*Ministry of Health & Population & its implementing agencies*) being national organ must play the lead role by taking the ownership of blood program in Nepal. Effective mobilization & accountability of the formed committee & bodies related to blood service program. Also revising the policy & legal framework with the consultation of stakeholders for effective management of blood program & sustainability of resources. Donors care & free availability of safe blood has to be integral part.**
2. **Monitoring, evaluation, research & supervision must be the integral part to carry out by developing the sustainable mechanism by government with the involvement of key stakeholders. Fund mobilization & continuation for blood program in long run must be attempt. Integration with multi sectors (health, education & media)**
3. **Technical support & capacitating human resource for non remunerated voluntary blood donation with regular support & coordination along with key stakeholders are the major part to be covered by NRCS for blood management for meeting the current needs.**
4. **BLODAN as being the umbrella forum for all donors, donor's organization must play the crucial role in mobilization of donor organization, regular donor care/support, awareness & motivational program. BLODAN has to have meaning full & effective presence as well as role in blood management structure of Nepal.**
5. **Addressing the lacking manpower on blood transfusion as well as less space of blood transfusion in curriculum/text & lacking the awareness specifically related to blood transfusion among the medical personnel/doctors, academics institution needs to have the serious concerned by developing the frame for blood transfusion in theoretical & practical. BLODAN as being key stakeholder have to be in this initiation.**
6. **External funding agencies or organization must look & act up for investing & integrating blood program in relevant working sector like health & education for implementation along with monitoring. Close working & coordination mechanism for blood related service and program with donor has to be developed compulsorily.**

Part – 7

7.1 Closing session

Closing session of conference conducted formally with chairing of chief guest along with invited distinguished guest & BLODAN Central Board Members. Formally seating of guest was done followed by the speech.

Chief guest Mr. Laxman Aryal – Executive Officer of Kathmandu Metro Politian Office expressed his happiness & appreciated the huge effort for conducting first national blood conference creating the history in Nepal. Also he insisted the declaration egress by first national blood conference is in need a valuable recommendation for government of Nepal & Kathmandu metro Politian office is also ready to do at its best for blood movement in local level. Lastly he concluded by thanking & congratulating BLODAN for doing such a mega event for raising the concern & giving the road map for blood program of Nepal. Similarly distinguished guest of closing ceremony also uttered their gladness on successful completion of first national blood conference with meaningful participation yielding the recommendation & also insisted that declaration of conference must have to be implemented by government as it is the road map of blood related program in Nepal for future. Also highlighted the volunteer effort carried out by the BLODAN to organize & manage conference with true spirit is really notable showing the role model of volunteer work in blood movement is inspiration to whole world hence government should think & act seriously towards sustainable program for motivation. Preamble of First National Blood Conference Declaration paper was presented in the presence of all participants along with chief guest. After the presentation of declaration paper participants approved to include the declaration of first national blood conference – 2013 in detail report to be prepared by BLODAN & submitting to government of Nepal as a road map for effective implementation.

With the closing ceremony of conference BLODAN also celebrated WBDD - 2013 marking the significance. On the occasion of WBDD, BLODAN honored regular donors for their continuous effort & dedication in blood donation. Donors were honored with silver, gold & diamond pin for more than 10, 25 & 50 times. Also running shield established by BLODAN for organizing high number blood donation camp in different categories was also honored with running shield. Marking the participation in historic occasion of blood movement BLODAN also honored all international delegates for their meaning full participation sharing & commitment. TYAGA (National Organization from India) & FIBDO honored BLODAN for organizing historic first national blood conference with token of love & appreciation letter. International delegates also expressed their gratitude towards conference & appreciated the invitation for letting them to share ideas, experiences & perspective. Also shared it's a learning opportunity to discern about the blood movements & practices in Nepal playing motivational factor to all participants. International delegates strongly emphasize & expect the action on declaration of conference quickly. Er. Sanubabu Prajapti delivered thanking speech & expressed appreciation towards all supporting organization & individual for their support to make successful & meaning full completion. Also insisted in future to continue national program & advocating for blood movement. Lastly different cultural groups performed in stages & concluded with dinner.

Part – 8

8.1 Conference Evaluation from the eyes of participants

Entire participants filled up and submitted to the conference management team. The evaluation team found very good responses. The feedback has kept confidential because of the verities of participants however evaluation marked their response by scaling on the base of their background and intellectual level. Evaluation teams convince on that the response of the participant's shows positive view about the conference. The major finding and key recommendation for the organizer as follows:

8.2 Key findings

- ◆ The session are tried to cover various relevant topic about Blood, however some sector has to be incorporate in the future program.
- ◆ The topic of “Clinical Practice Guide on Blood Transfusion” presented by Dr. Bishesh Poudyal has been appreciated by big number of participants and Vision of BLODAN presented by Mr. Mahendra Bilas joshi has also been marked as effective presentation.
- ◆ Hall environment has been marked as substandard than the height of the program
- ◆ Higher number of participants are willing to give continue their participation in such kind of program.
- ◆ Participants have shown their feeling for bearing responsibility to achieve 100 percent non remunerated voluntary blood donation.

8.3 Key Recommendation

- ◆ Such program should be continued as possible
- ◆ Allow the sufficient time and space for the interaction
- ◆ Simplify the structure and content



On the occasion of World Blood Donor Day (14 June 2013)**

Safe blood saves millions of lives each year. Provision of safe blood is a fundamental need for the health system of every country. Blood cannot be synthesized artificially. Human beings are the only source of this life-saving product. But a shortage of safe blood in several developing countries often leads to unnecessary deaths or ill-health. Hence, there is an urgent need for more people to donate blood on a regular basis to save precious lives. Against an annual estimated requirement of 17.5 million blood units in the South-East Asia Region, only around 12.5 million units are collected every year.

Blood can also be a potential source of transmission of several diseases. These include among others, HIV, hepatitis B and hepatitis C. The shortage of blood and the risk of often fatal infections can be considerably reduced by promoting voluntary, non-remunerated blood donations. All over the world it has been shown that regular, voluntary, non-remunerated donors from low-risk population groups are the safest donors. In the South-East Asia Region, only 10% of donated blood is obtained from voluntary donors. However, there is a wide variation between, as well as within, the countries. Clearly, the leadership to prioritize this critical area



World Blood Donor Day (14 June) was established as an annual event by the World Health Assembly in 2005. Since then, people all over the world celebrate this day. The event serves to raise awareness for safe blood and blood products and to thank voluntary non-remunerated donors for their life-saving gifts of blood. The celebration of this day is supported by partners including WHO, the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, the International Society of Blood Transfusion, and the International Federation of Blood Donor Organizations also aims to raise awareness globally about the need for regular and voluntary blood donation. The ultimate goal is that every country should achieve 100% voluntary and unpaid blood donation. The focus for this year's campaign – the tenth anniversary of World Blood Donor Day – is “Blood donation as a life-saving gift”. WHO will continue to provide technical support to global efforts in augmenting the availability of safe blood. We are also committed to working closely with the collaborating organizations for promoting voluntary blood donations through active involvement of governmental and nongovernmental organizations. Together, we are striving towards the ultimate aim of assuring universal access to safe blood and blood products.

Blood Transfusion service

- Essential component of Health service.
- In 1991, government mandated NRCS for collection, storage and supply of Blood to the hospital
- National Public Health Laboratory designated as
 - focal point of blood safety (MoHRP).
 - Supervise all BTSCs on all issues of quality assurance.
 - Organization and NEQAS by all BTSC is mandatory.
 - Reference Laboratory for TTI Screening for BTS.



Government commitment and support

- In 1993, developed National Blood Policy and updated in 2006 and revision 2nd time - ongoing

The main functions of NTAC

- Regular monitoring of BTSCs for compliance of quality standards.
- BTSCs not complying with the required standards will be suggested to take measures to improve performance within a given timeframe. If within this given timeframe also, BTSC not able to comply with the required standard, may suggest NSC for withdrawal of such BTSC.
- Prepare national guidelines on the clinical use of blood.
- Suggest ways to retain voluntary donors and improve repeat donations.

Contd....

- Suggest a suitable curriculum for formal & Informal training in transfusion medicine.
- Approve specifications of equipment and consumables for procurement.
- Form working committees if needed.
- Membership of the committee will be renewed every 4 years.



Who can but after some time

- Cold, flu or sore throat, please wait **one week** after recovery or treatment
- Tooth extraction or dental work, please wait **3 days** after treatment
- Skin infections (minor), wait **1 week** after complete healing
- Normal pregnancy, please wait **6 weeks** after delivery and when you are not breast-feeding.

Components of Blood

Whole blood

- Packed red blood
- Platelet concentration
- FFP
- Cryo

Determination of compatibility

- Cross match is needed only for whole blood, granulocyte and packed cell
- FFP should be ABO compatible
- Blood in emergency situation – O group, that's why called universal donor

Indication for packed RBC

- Transfuse when symptomatic
- 1 unit will increase 1 g of hemoglobin
- With disease that will respond to hematinics and erythropoietin
- Whole blood should be avoided if target is only to increase hemoglobin

Infusion Rate

- 1 unit of packed cell over 2-3 hours
- If patient's situation does not permit, divide the unit
- 5 ml per minute or less for the first 15 minutes
- Severe reaction is noticed in the first 50 ml; if no complication, increase the flow





Autologous Hematopoietic Stem Cell Transplant


- Patients act as their own donor.
- E.g.; a person who is about to undergo cancer treatment will have his or her own stem cells removed (harvested) and frozen for later use.
- After the person receives chemotherapy and/or radiation, the stem cells are thawed and put back into the person's body



 **Bone Marrow Transplantation**


- ❖ Involves extracting bone marrow containing normal stem cells from a healthy donor.
- ❖ Transferring it to a recipient whose body cannot produce proper quantities of normal blood cells
- ❖ The goal of the transplant is to rebuild the recipient's blood cells and immune system and hopefully cure the underlying ailment.

 **Time Matters**



- HLA typing is increasingly done using DNA techniques and can take several days to complete
- In cases where the patient's HLA type is quite common, it can take a minimum of 4 to 6 weeks to obtain the donor's stem cells.
- If HLA Type is uncommon, then the time taken will be much higher.



If the Bone Marrow is destroyed, either from a malignant, non-malignant or genetic disorder, a Stem Cell transplant becomes necessary.

 **How the stem cells are collected**


- From the Bone Marrow (usually the Hip Bone).

 **How the stem cells are collected**

- From peripheral blood i.e. the blood stream in the body
 - The donor is given Growth Factor injections for 4-5 days.
 - Stem cells are extracted by 'apheresis', same procedure as in the case of Platelet Donation
 - The apheresis procedure can take 3-4 hours
 - In most cases stem cells will be taken from the blood stream

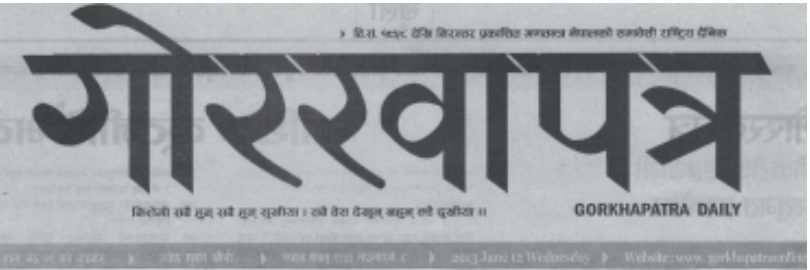

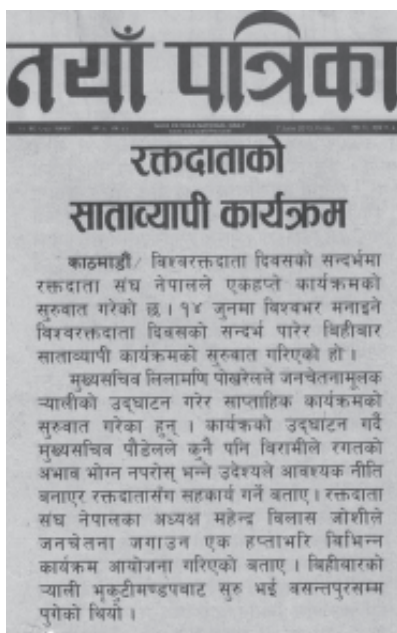
